

ASTONLEE HOUSE WIVENHOE, QLD

The brief called for a robust yet liveable home—low maintenance, liveable and durable within the rural setting, with a high level of sophistication internally.

To create the form, a simple yet sculptural sectional element was derived through the use of an angled skillion roof and angled pre-cast panels which are used to bookend each pavilion in a linear design which allows for living spaces to be distributed along the building. The pavilion model allowed the creation of individual spaces with changes in density, material and focus.

Blade walls separate the pavillions to create breathing spaces and articulate the external elevations, celebrating the transition between spaces.

Set into the top of the hill, the house is positioned to overlook the landscape without imposing on its surrounds.
